Important: Caution as to bringing animal products into Japan from overseas

This is a guidance for bringing meat or animal products into Japan.

X See the guidance on "Taking anilmal products out" if you take animal products out from Japan.

ATTENTION:

If you bring meat or animal products illegally, you can also be arrested.

Violators would be punishable with imprisonment or fine.

Please note before you come to Japan:

On 22nd April 2019, Japanese government has <u>strengthened penalties</u> for bringing meat or animal products from overseas illegally.

- 1. Animal Quarantine Service in Japan (AQS) takes strict action against bringing meat or animal products illegally regardless of the consent to abandon.
- 2. If you failed to declare meat or animal products and found them in your luggage, you would be punishable.
- 3. It will take time for import inspections due to record your passport and boarding pass.
- 4. AQS notifies police of unethical cases.

On 1st July 2020, due to the amendment of the Act on Domestic Animal Infectious Diseases Control;

- 1. The existing penalty of a fine of up to 1 million yen will be <u>raised to up to</u> 3 million yen.
- 2. If you bring meat or animal products, you would be punishable with imprisonment for not more than 3 years or a fine of up to 3 million yen (up to 50 million yen for businesses).
- 3. Animal Quarantine officer can <u>ask if you have any animal products and inspect your luggage</u>.
- 4. In addition, Animal Quarantine Officer has the authority to dispose of meat or animal products that have been brought illegally.
- 5. <u>There are arrests</u> on the charge of bringing meat or animal products illegally.
- 6. If you <u>failed to declare meat or animal products</u> and found them in your luggage, you would be <u>punishable</u>.
- 7. It will take time for import inspections due to <u>record your passport and boarding pass</u>.
- * African swine fever, foot and mouth disease, avian influenza and other animal infectious diseases are spreading all over the world.
- * Generally it's difficult to get inspection certificates issued by the

exporting country's government for animal products for personal use, therefore you cannot bring in most of animal products.

* Above rules apply if they're for yourself, gifts, bought in a shop (including at an airport), home grown, homemade, heat processed or vacuum packed
