The 3rd “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition is Now Open for Entries

The 3rd “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition is now open for entries. Higashikawa, the “Town of Photography” in Hokkaido, together with architect Kengo Kuma, invites young people from all over the world to submit proposals for a new KAGU.

The theme of this year's competition is “Furniture Fits in the Open Air.” The deadline for submissions is March 31, 2023.



◆Calling for designs that embody KAGU — a new, mindful way of life

The town of Higashikawa is a major producer of Asahikawa furniture. We have established “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition together with Kengo Kuma, calling for designs that embody KAGU—a new, mindful way of life for the young people who will shoulder the responsibilities of the future. The 1st competition, held in 2021, received 1,876 pre-entries from 41 countries and regions and eventually as many as 834 submissions from 36 countries and regions. The 2nd contest received 1,588 pre-entries from 40 countries and regions, and eventually 581 final submissions from 23 countries and regions.

The theme of the 3rd competition is “Furniture Fits in the Open Air.” Students, both domestic and overseas, at the age of 30 or younger are eligible to participate. The deadline for entries is noon on March 31, 2023 Japan Standard Time (pre-registration is required by February 28). Ten works will be selected from among the entries, and the award-winning works will be determined at the final judging in Higashikawa in June, 2023.

“KAGU” is an inclusive term for what connects humans to the world, and is defined as an extension of the traditional concept of furniture. We look forward to receiving your many proposals for new “KAGU.”

The 3rd “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition Overview

◆Introduction

Higashikawa in Hokkaido, with its small size and thriving furniture production industry, has long implemented programs that would only be possible here: It starts with the “Your Chair” project, which gives the children a sense of safety and belonging from a young age. In Elementary School, the children learn while surrounded by wooden furniture. When they graduate Junior High School, as a graduation present, they take home their wooden chairs that they have used and cared for over three years. It is now time to start a new project and train the young people who will be the leaders of the next generation.

As the world endures the COVID-19 crisis, the problems with our overcrowded metropolitan lifestyles have become clearer, and a search for a new lifestyle has begun. The resources and possibilities in each region are beginning to provide inklings of ideas for the development of this new lifestyle. The Third Annual “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition

- Introduction:

We are entering a time in which the value and potential of rural areas are being reconsidered. Higashikawa, the "Town of Photography," and "Cultural Capital of Photography," is a beautiful town in Hokkaido, Japan. Located in a beautiful rural setting, surrounded by the Daisetsusan mountains, it is also blessed with pure groundwater. With the aim of communicating the richness of life through architecture and furniture, the town has promoted a new initiative in collaboration with architect Kengo Kuma, who has a strong interest in the use of architecture and design in rural settings.

- Purpose:

The town of Higashikawa is a major producer of Asahikawa furniture. We are calling for designs that embody KAGU, a new, mindful way of life for the young people who will shoulder the responsibilities of the future.

KAGU is an extension of the conventional concept of furniture that aims to connect people to the world. We use a variety of objects in our daily lives, but it is difficult to see the context in which they are made and used. We realized that in the current way of life, we handle objects without care and treat them poorly, all in the name of saving time and effort; people rush to get results, and don't take the time to think deeply about the items they are using. This can have many harmful effects.

Our hope is that the upcoming KAGU design competition will provide an opportunity for your ideas, which have a lot of potential, to take shape and be used for a long time, so that a path towards mindful living can be realized little by little.

- Contest Details:

Theme: 「Furniture Fits in the Open Air」

- The work must be designed by applicant themselves in strict accordance with these guidelines, the law and competition rules.
- The work must be applicant's original work and be previously unpublished except for class work or graduation displays.

- Eligibility:

Students enrolled in various educational institutions in Japan and abroad who are 30 years of age or younger as of March 31, 2023 are eligible to participate. Students 30 or under who are graduating in March 2023 are eligible as well.

Group entries are also accepted. In that case, all members of the group must meet the requirements.

- Number of Entries:

One per applicant or one per group.

※Each individual may only be involved in the submission of one work, whether as an individual or in a group: multiple entries by one person, such as submitting an individual entry and a group entry or participating in more than one group entry will not be accepted.

- Registration Fee: none

- Submission:

The title, main idea of the design, explanation of the work, as well as a sketch, drawing, CG model, or

model photo of the work should fit onto a single A3-size sheet (single-sided, landscape layout). The submission should be a PDF file. Only English or Japanese may be used.

- Pre-registration:

Deadline for pre-registration: Tuesday February 28th, 2023 at 12 p.m.(noon) Japan Standard Time.

- Pre-registration is required for participation in this competition. If you do not pre-register by the deadline, you will not be able to submit any works.
- Please register through the “Kengo Kuma & Higashikawa” KAGU Design Competition official website. An email address is required for registration (the group representative’s email address in the case of group applications). Once your registration is completed, your registration number, the URL to the submission form and password will be issued to the email address that you registered.

- Submissions and Submission Period:

Submission period: Friday March 24th, 2023 to Friday March 31st, 2023 at 12:00 p.m. (noon) Japan Standard Time.

Please submit the following items during the submission period using the submission form provided at the time of pre-registration process. Submissions that are not submitted on the form, that contain inappropriate or false information, or that do not meet the requirements may be invalidated.

① Submission **【File Format: PDF】** :

- The title, main idea of the design, explanation of the work, as well as a sketch, drawing, CG model, or model photo of the work should fit onto a single A3-size sheet (single-sided, landscape layout). The minimum font size is 10 points.
- The registration number received during the pre-registration process should be indicated in the lower right-hand corner of the work in 72-point size.
- Only English or Japanese may be used.
- The work should not include any expressions, symbols, or characters that may identify the entrant.
- The submission should be an A3 PDF file.
- The file size must be 3MB or less.

② A document certifying that you are a student enrolled in an educational institution. In the case of a group, please submit one for all members. **【File Format: PDF, jpeg or GIF】** :

- This document can be an enrollment certificate or student ID card, etc. showing that you are a student enrolled in an educational institution. It should be PDF, jpeg, or GIF format.
- The file size must be 1MB or less per file.

※The email address that you registered and the password that you received at the time of pre-registration process are required at the time of the submission.

● Important Notes:

- Please use an e-mail address that can receive e-mails from the organizer when you pre-register.

- An email will be sent to you upon completion of the pre-registration. If you do not receive the e-mail, please check your spam mailbox or reconfirm your registration information.
- After the submission period is over, no changes or corrections can be made to the entry, nor can the entry be cancelled.
- The applicant is responsible for all costs associated with the production of the work.
- If the images or illustrations used in the work may infringe on the rights of a third party, it is the responsibility of the entrant to obtain the necessary permissions before using them.
- If a work is deemed to infringe on another's rights such as copyright, the entry or prize will be cancelled. If there is a lawsuit or objection from a third party regarding the work, such as a lawsuit for infringement of rights or compensation for damages, the applicant shall be responsible for resolving the matter at their own risk and expense, and neither the organizer nor the sponsors will bear any responsibility.
- If an entry is found to be identical or similar to a previously published design, or if it is judged to infringe on another's rights, the entry or prize will be cancelled. In addition, the organizer will not be responsible for any trouble caused by infringement of a third party's rights.

● Judging:

- 10 works will be selected as finalists by the judges in mid-May 2023.
- The selected applicants and their works will be announced on the competition official website, as well as by individual correspondence.
- Final judging will be conducted from the 10 selected works to determine the winners of each award.
- The applicants selected as finalists will be asked to submit the following by the date specified by the organizer prior to the final judging. ※The details will be notified separately to the selected applicants.
 - a presentation video (within 5 minutes)
 - a 1/5-1/1 scale model of their design (Any materials may be used in the model; please note that models will not be returned.)
- In the final judging, the judges will discuss and decide on each award based on the submitted works and the presentation videos.
- In principle, if you are selected as a finalist, you must attend the award ceremony to be held in Higashikawa,

Hokkaido, Japan. (Scheduled to be June 25th, 2023)

- In the event that there is any falsehood in the information entered on the submission form, any violation of the submission guidelines, or any other circumstances that are deemed inappropriate, the entry will not be judged and the prize may be withdrawn.
- We are unable to respond to enquiries about the judging process, criteria, results or other related matters.

- Final Judging and the Award Ceremony Date:

Sunday, June 25th, 2023. The planned location is Higashikawa, Hokkaido, Japan.

- Awards and Prizes:

- Kengo Kuma Award (Grand prize, 1 entry): 500,000 yen
- Excellence Award (3 entries): 100,000 yen
- Honorable mention (6 entries)

※ The ten winners will be invited to attend the final judging and the award ceremony.

※ If you are from outside Japan, you will need a passport for you to be invited to Higashikawa. Please note that the period between the selection decision and the application procedure is very short, so please prepare your passport in advance.

※ The ten winners will be provided with accommodations during their stay in the town, as well as transportation fees to and from the nearest airport to their place of residence. In that case of a group, in some cases, only the representative of the group may be invited.

※ Prize-winning works may be commercialized. Details of commercialization will be discussed separately with the prizewinners.
